

Presentation Guidelines

Dear Colleagues,

Please read the following guidance in preparation of your presentation:

- Keep checking the programme, it is relatively complete, but last minute changes happen.
- Presentations are 15 minutes with 5 minutes allocated to questions and answers with a specific focus on your paper. Each session will then have a second discussion on similarities/differences between papers and future development of the topic.
- All the usual equipment will be available for your presentations. Bring your presentation on a USB as it is still often the fastest way to set things up and quickly move between presentations.
- As a general guide, ensure you have enough time to talk about why your argument or findings are important to research and practice, give examples where possible to ground your work, and make sure you don't get lost in methodological detail.
- The focus on of the symposium is on what is required to further the field of MFW beyond its current limitations, help develop each other's papers and create research collaborations, so please keep this in mind in your contributions.
