Table 2 provides the data of the Survey respondents' ethnicity. This Table adds detail to Figure 2 in the Report (p. 5). Please note that as respondents could choose more than one ethnicity, the total percentage is greater than 100%. Responses were classified using the Ethnicity New Zealand Standard Classification.¹

Table 3 gives the percentage of Survey respondents who were born in New Zealand or were not born in New Zealand. It adds further detail to section 2.3 of the Report ('Country of Birth', p. 4). It is worth noting that being born outside of New Zealand does not indicate citizenship status (i.e. respondents could be born outside New Zealand and hold citizenship or permanent residency). It also does not illustrate the length of time lived in New Zealand. It is, therefore, a broad picture of the respondents.
